Property ownership in the Nob Hill area of Cheyenne may go back to the 19th Century. But that is, for now at least, the chosen land for a new hospital. The acreage of land the hospital wants is far more than necessary to build a hospital. It almost sounds like they want to become resellers of much of the land to help defray the price of their acquisitions.

That, under the County's right of eminent domain and/or condemnation, is unacceptable and should be forbidden.
